Community Children's Nursing Pathway



THE TEAM

The community children's nursing (CCN) team is made up of nurses and clinical support workers who support the needs of children and young people (CYP) with complex and specialist nursing needs. The team plan and provide care in the community working within mainstream and specialist schools, patients homes and other community settings.

The nursing needs of the children we support may include:

- Support with chronic respiratory support and management
- Management of artificial airways (nasopharyngeal airway (NPA)/ tracheostomy) and long-term ventilation
- Long-term home oxygen therapy
- Support with specialist treatment regimes
- Management of indwelling venous devices
- Enteral feeding support
- Children with life-limiting conditions requiring nursing interventions
- Children requiring palliative and end of life care, including bereavement support.

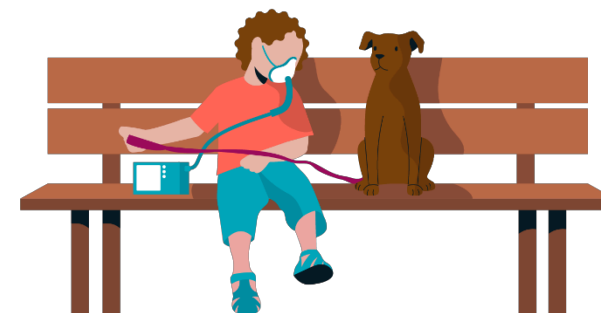
The CCN team provide a placement environment accessed by students. We would encourage families to welcome and accept care delivered by students under the supervision of the named CCN.

WHAT WE DO

- We support and empower families to meet their child's healthcare needs at home
- We aim to reduce hospital visits and admissions
- We provide specialist nursing care in the community
- We act as a named nurse and help plan children and young people's care
- We liaise with other health, education and social care professionals to co-ordinate and support the provision of care to children and young people with complex care needs
- We offer emotional support including play activities and distraction to support with unpleasant or painful interventions

PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS OF CARE

Our staff will treat children, young people and families with dignity and respect

- Children and young people (CYP) will be allocated a named children's community nurse
- CYP and families will be included in care and treatment decisions
- Where possible, visits will be planned and agreed in collaboration with CYP and families
- We won't share confidential information regarding CYP and families with other professionals without your consent, unless it puts a child or young person at risk not to do so.
- Our duty nurse service is available for advice and support during working hours (Mon-Friday 08:30-5pm). This is not an emergency service and if emergency medical advice and/or treatment is required you must call 999 immediately).
