See what you are good at.



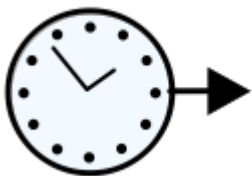
See if there are things you need more help with.

This is so we can make sure you have the best help for you.

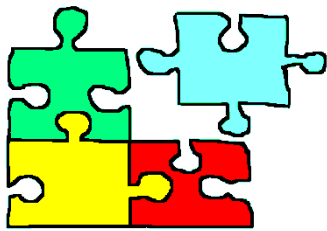


Knowing what you are good at and what you need help with might help you in the future too.

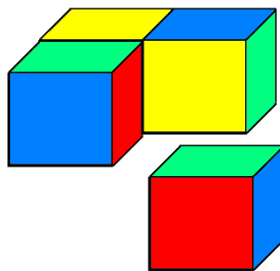
If you choose to do the assessment the Psychologist may ask you to:



Answer some questions.



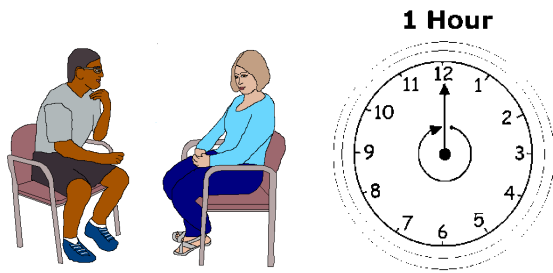
Do some puzzles and games.

You can meet for a couple of hours.

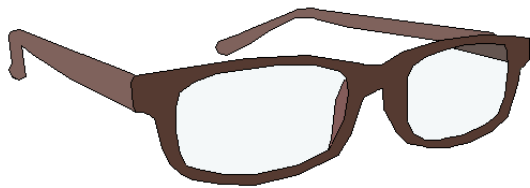


If you get tired in the assessment you can ask for a short break.



If you want to stop the assessment you can say "stop".

Things to bring with you:



If you wear glasses bring them with you.



If you wear hearing aids bring them and batteries with you.
